THE ADVICE FOR ANYONE IN ANY SETTING IS TO FOLLOW THESE MAIN GUIDELINES.

The most common symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are recent onset of a new continuous cough and/or high temperature. If you have these symptoms, however mild, stay at home and do not leave your house for 7 days from when your symptoms started. You do not need to call NHS 111 to go into self-isolation. If your symptoms worsen during home isolation or are no better after 7 days, contact NHS 111 online. If you have no internet access, you should call NHS 111. For a medical emergency dial 999.

Wash your hands more often than usual, for 20 seconds using soap and hot water, particularly after coughing, sneezing and blowing your nose, or after being in public areas where other people are doing so. Use hand sanitiser if that's all you have access to.

To reduce the spread of germs when you cough or sneeze, cover your mouth and nose with a tissue, or your sleeve (not your hands) if you don't have a tissue, and throw the tissue away immediately. Then wash your hands or use a hand sanitising gel.

Clean and disinfect regularly touched objects and surfaces using your regular cleaning products to reduce the risk of passing the infection on to other people.

At the current time and based on our understanding of what is known of COVID-19 and other similar respiratory viruses, it is likely that older people and those with chronic medical conditions may be vulnerable to severe disease. As more information emerges, recommendations may change.




It's been a very testing and challenging time for all but as we continue through, this will be seen as an historical period of change". Michael, CVH Accounting

...no place for hate

Supporting Black Lives Matter through education



The Empire Windrush arrived 71 years ago - bringing with it a new generation of black Britons. But black British history didn't begin there, and two new digital series from the BBC, Alt History and Black To Life, seek to explore the untold stories of minority communities in Britain that make up an important, but often overlooked, part of our history. Both series will be published by BBC Stories on YouTube.

David Olusoga says: "When I was growing up, I learnt nothing about black British history at school. It was as if we had no history. These Alt History films reveal the black presence in the great events of a hundred years ago."

Daisy Griffith, the BBC's digital commissioner in factual, says: "The black experience is an important part of British history, but too often it's overlooked, and undertaught. The stories featured in both Black To Life and Alt History are fascinating insights into a world we often hear about - such as the First World War, or Queen Victoria's court - through an angle we rarely hear much about. We hope that both series will help people to think again, and to learn about and gain a new appreciation of our shared history.

The Unwanted: The Secret Windrush Files, is another film by David Olusoga where he opens secret government files to show how the Windrush scandal and the 'hostile environment' for black British immigrants has been 70 years in the making. David reveals how today's scandal is rooted in the secrets of the past. The first Windrush generation wereCommonwealth citizens - many of them ex-servicemen - coming to rebuild war-torn Britain. Yet even before arriving, they were viewed by the government with hostility. Civil servants and MPs warned of dire consequences if what they called a 'coloured element' was introduced into the UK. This program shows how the injustice is still affecting Black lives today.

Broxtowe Borough Council stands in support of those who are campaigning for equality. Councillor Milan Radulovic MBE, Leader of the Council said: "There is no place for racism or hate in Broxtowe or anywhere else in the world. We have been incredibly shocked by what has happened in America and it is a reminder that no one should be complacent about racism. We stand in solidarity with people of all races and backgrounds to ensure that we can eradicate racism and inequality for good.

Councillor Steve Carr, Deputy Leader of the Council added: "Everyone in Broxtowe has the right to be treated fairly, with courtesy and respect and without discrimination and prejudice. We need change to be long lasting and we can only achieve this is we tackle inequality head on. Here in Broxtowe we will do just that. Leaders, both nationally and locally, should be bringing people together not driving them apart." Last year, the Council signed a Nottinghamshire Hate Crime Pledge as part of its commitment to tackling hate crime.
