

Meet local reader, John Green as we reminisce about his contributions to our area via his work as a stonemason.



Our local reader John, shares his happy memories of a career spanning over five decades...

"Having lived in Beeston all my life, at the age of 83 I have quite a few stories to tell! At 15, I left school. Having lost my dad, my mum remarried again to Jack Pearson, a local stonemason, who already had four daughters. So when I came in to his life he was delighted to offer me an apprenticeship. I thought 'well, yes I'll give it a go, not really knowing what it was about!' So I started on my 15th birthday at William Woodsends". Established in 1837, Woodsends is famous for being commissioned to build the war memorial on the Trent Embankment, of which John's stepfather Jack had worked on.

"Over the next five years I served my apprenticeship, then came my 'National Service'. For the next eighteen months I spent my time in Malaya, returning to Woodsends for another year. In search of more money I moved to Furse. From there I worked on places like Hardwick Hall and Thoresby Hall, beautiful historical buildings that I was proud to be working on. Although in 1963 we had sixteen weeks of frost, that was quite a challenge!

At the end of 1963 I got married, to my wife Christine, at the same time I changed jobs again and went to work for Norman Douglas for seven years. After that I decided it was time to go and work for myself. I teamed up with three architects and over a period of time I have worked on nearly sixty churches and buildings, including the Nottingham University, Sandbeck Park and Lichfield Cathedral. My proudest work has to be St Mary's Cathedral in Nottingham. I visited last year to check out my buttresses! A couple asked why I was there, and when I told them, they shook my hand in admiration!


As chairman of the Beeston Boys Brigade for over thirty five years, I ran the local cricket team, captained the Chilwell Cricket Club for over twenty five years, ran the Old Boys football team and shared many happy memories with friends.

I've met lots of different characters along the way...

A notable feature of the Park Estate in Nottingham is the gas lights, one of the largest current networks of gas lights within the UK and outside of London. I worked on them, and remember the 'Lightlighter' coming round lighting the gas, such a character! Lady Manvers of Thoresby Hall, approached me one day asking if my jug of tea was one of hers - it was my old billy can tea jug! I've also shared a drink with the Earl of Scarborough on completion of working at Sandbeck Park.

There's so much I could share as I have spent over fifty years doing the job I loved. Many of the churches in our area I have proudly done work on and take great pleasure in visiting, knowing I have contributed. Of course the pandemic has put pay to that and restrictions have been hard to digest, but I can still sit with my thoughts and look forward to when I can return again with my family".

All this from a man who when hearing the Beatles said - "they'll never last!" Thank you John for sharing your memories of life and work as a member of our local community. 'Nobby' as some of you





healthy heart



At a time we are encourage to stay home as much as possible we still have to maintain our health. Sitting too long isn't good for us. So here's some welcome suggestions....

Reduce time spent sitting

Unless you are a wheelchair user, there is evidence to show that prolonged periods of sitting can increase your risk of developing heart disease. Modern technology has changed how we spend our work and leisure time. It is not uncommon for people to spend several hours every day sitting behind a desk, watching TV, playing computer games or sitting at the wheel of a car.

We have some tips to reduce the amount of time you spend sitting.

Take regular breaks from your seat

Whenever you are going to be sitting for prolonged periods of time, set an alarm to remind yourself to get up and move around regularly. If you are sitting watching TV, why not use the advert breaks to prompt you to get moving. You could use this time to run up and down the stairs, dance around the living room or do some star jumps.

Step away from your desk

The government has recently advised us to work from home over the winter if we can. As a result of this, many people are missing out on their active commute to work, such as walking or cycling. If you are working from home without moving much, you could set a timer to remind yourself to get up and move at regular intervals. Why not set yourself a 5 to 10 minute chore to complete once an hour that will get you moving, such as hanging laundry, hoovering or cleaning windows.

Active phone calls

Avoid staying seated during phone calls. Use the opportunity to walk around or do some squats and lunges. If you own exercise equipment, such as a stationary bike or treadmill, you could hop on for the duration of your phone call. Be careful not to get too out of breath during your phone call. You could pump up the pace for a few minutes after the call ends.

Choose hobbies that will get you moving

If your hobbies involve lots of time sitting, such as needlework, computer games, board games, reading or painting, try to get up and move around at regular intervals. You could set a timer to remind yourself to move more often. You could also look for new hobbies that will get you moving more, such as gardening, walking and DIY. If you enjoy reading, why not listen to

an audio book through headphones while you take a walk or read while you pedal on a stationary bike.

Is online shopping keeping you in your seat?

Unless you are shielding or self-isolating due to COVID-19, you could switch from sitting in front of a screen to do online food shopping and start walking or cycling to the shops instead. Not only will this increase your physical activity, but it will also free up supermarket delivery



New cycle lanes are planned to help people get active during covid-19





A range of pop up cycle lanes, street closures and cycle parking facilities have been put in place across the city to encourage more active travel during the covid-19 pandemic.

The last cycle route, funded through Nottingham City Council's Emergency Active Travel Fund, is being installed in the Carlton Road area this

The measures aim to support social distancing by making it easier for people to walk and cycle, and to deter cut-through driving.

The latest cycle route is being installed as new 'High' level restrictions are introduced by the Government in Nottingham and Nottinghamshire, including advice to reduce the number of journeys people are making, if necessary walking or cycling, or avoiding busy times and routes on public transport where possible.

Councillor Adele Williams, Portfolio Holder for Transport, said: "Our pop up cycle lanes have focused on developing new and improved cycling corridors on key routes in the north and east of the city.

"We've also introduced two low traffic neighbourhoods, in the Arboretum and Derby Road areas, to deter motorists using these residential areas a cut-through and, by doing so, create a more inviting environment, and more space, for people to walk or ride a bike.

"These measures are all about keeping Nottingham moving safely, by encouraging more active travel and reducing demand on public transport while social distancing guidelines are in place.

"We are monitoring all these schemes and inviting residents, businesses and road users to let us know what they think."

The following trial cycle lanes are now signed and lined with easy to spot orange paint, and most of the routes are segregated to some degree. In some locations this hasn't been possible, due to access required to bus stops, or driveways, or due to impact on public transport.

Hucknall Road - An important corridor connecting the City Hospital and ring road. This is the trial phase of a proposed longer route.

St Ann's Wells Road - Cycle lane, with some segregation and improved pedestrian crossing opportunities, and more space for cycling and pedestrians. A permanent scheme is now being

Carlton Road- We're creating a quieter route away from this busy road, ideal for less confident cyclists, linking Porchester Road to the city centre including a new temporary pedestrian crossing. Plans are also being developed for a more permanent solution for the whole of Carlton Road and Porchester Road.

Station Street/Canal Street – A segregated route through the city centre connecting the various routes into and out of the city in all directions.

Oundle Drive - Improvements to existing facilities on Middleton Boulevard/Oundle Drive, where the layout is hindered by poor visibility and footway width. We've moved cyclists off the shared path and onto a dedicated two way cycle lane set back from residential entrances for safety. We are looking to put in an enhanced permanent facility following discussions with residents.

Derby Road - Temporary cycle lane created on the inbound lane to complement the existing bus lane for outbound cyclists.

In addition, the council has installed several pop up cycle parking racks in the city centre and at locations including Colwick Park, Forest Recreation Ground and Victoria Embankment, while security improvements have been made at the permanent cycle hubs at Clifton South and Toton Lane park and ride sites.

These are the latest emergency active travel scheme measures to be put in place, following the closure to through traffic of Victoria Embankment at the beginning of August, and the creation of car-free streets outside eight schools in the city in September.

The fund has also been used to support the provision of bikes to more than 160 jobseekers, and to run pop up Dr Bike sessions.

The City Council is also inviting suggestions from residents on further areas for improvement. This can be done at the Let's Keep Nottingham Moving Safely.

The garden is being created with support from Nottingham City Council, Nottingham based baby loss support charity, Forever Stars and the FCC Communities Foundation, who award grants to community projects.

The creation of the 'Serenity Garden' at Highfields Park, will be designed to provide a welcoming space to allow reflection and thoughtfulness for both the families of baby loss but also the wider community too.

The garden will have informal planting, a water feature, special seating areas and two locally designed and built sculptures, created by Nottingham artist Rachel Carter, which will allow for parents to request the names of their little ones to be attached by the artist as a lasting dedication

Forever Stars are a Nottingham based baby loss support charity, supporting parents and families of still birth and early infant loss, founded in January 2014 by Richard and Michelle Daniels following the devastating still birth of their daughter Emily in Dec 2013.

To mark the start of construction, that should be complete by the end of the year, Richard and Jo Daniels from Forever Stars joined Lillian Greenwood MP, Cllr Sally Longford, deputy Leader of Nottingham City Council, Portfolio Holder of Leisure, Culture and IT, Cllr Dave Trimble, local ward Cllr Pavlos Kotsonis to break ground.

Cllr Dave Trimble, Portfolio Holder for Leisure, Culture and IT, said: "We are happy to support Forever Stars in creating such a poignant and important garden for local families.

"We have been transforming previously underused areas of Highfields Park for some time now and this new

"We have been transforming previously underused areas of Highfields Park for some time now and this new garden will not only give parents a place to grieve and remember - but it will offer the wider community a new space to enjoy and appreciate in the park."

caribbean ghost story

A ghost or restless spirit is known as a 'Duppy' in Jamaica, or a Jumbie in many smaller Caribbean islands.

Traditionally, a good duppy is usually a deceased family member or friend who 'dreams you' – meaning they appear in your dreams and give you advice or information. Bad duppies on the other hand can be harmful or malevolent and can be set on you by someone who doesn't like you, through a supernatural practice called Obeah, that dates back to the days of slavery.

Many duppy stories originate from the transatlantic slave trade in the 1600s, with the most popular stories featuring the Rolling Calf, a huge, wicked calf-like creature that rolled along the road blocking the way and chasing night-time travellers; and the Ol'Hige, a witch who sheds her skin and flies by night, taking the form of an owl. She harms people by sucking their breath while they're sleeping and was especially dangerous to babies.

Here's a very short duppy story:

Once a man was travelling in a dray packed with sugar. The molasses off the sugar was trailing underneath the dray. Two duppies came up and was sucking the molasses, an' say, "After the molasses so sweet, how is the sugar?" The drayman happened to hear it, wheeled his whip in the air an' give the duppy a good lick. The Duppies ran off, crying, "Me dead one time, me dead one time, me can't dead two time!"

Duppies are everywhere

Duppies feature in all kinds of places, from books and songs to Caribbean sayings and even PlayStation games, with some games having characters known as duppies.

They appear in Ian Fleming's James Bond novel 'Live and Let Die', which mentions them and the Rolling Calf in the chapter 'The Undertaker's Wind'. Bob Marley's song 'Duppy Conqueror' in 1971, which saw Marley as the conqueror and the duppy anyone draining his energy. Plus Tony Matterhorn's song 'Dancehall Duppy' in 2011.

There are lots of Caribbean sayings and phrases featuring duppies, including:


'duppy know who fi frighten' – which means bullies know who to pick on and how to exploit the weak; and



you can hear people complain when these unwelcome plants appear in their gardens 'Duppy umbrella spring up all in the front of the house'. Similarly, parents and adults would often use duppies to discourage children from staying out late by saying things like 'Careful how you walking back home, duppies gwine be out this time a night'.

WHY EVERYONE'S WINTER GARDEN IS DIFFERENT

The RHS (Royal Horticultural Society) Hardiness Rating runs from H1 (mild/indoor climate) to H7 (UK outdoors). These are guides for the UK that dictate which plant species can grow outdoors and which plant species will require either an indoor environment or a greenhouse, heated or unheated. Plants fully exposed to the elements need to match around H5-6 rating to survive through a winter

We can see though how much a winter can vary even in a small geographic area, as well as from year to year. If you add 'milder winters' into the equation this can make a big difference. The Met Office says that the decade 2007-2016 had the mildest winters in the UK in three centuries, with an average winter temperature of 4C.

So even if you're reading winter gardening advice for your area, it may not be the right advice for you. It's a question of understanding your own patch and adapting what you do, based on what you find works. Take into account the' micro-climate' of your garden.

The nightmare conditions in the UK are a warm February, a week of bitter frost in early March, and then a fortnight of cold, wet, dark conditions. The first causes plants to start growing, the frost damages the new growth and the miserable conditions allow the plant to become attacked by bacteria and fungi. This sort of thing really does happen, and causes considerable damage to our plants when

So as a rough guide we might say that a plant graded as H4 would be okay in a sheltered spot during an average winter but keep an eye out for very cold spells and maybe cover with fleece if needed. A plant graded as H5-H6 should withstand a typical UK winter in most circumstances but remember the 'micro-climate' plays a part in this as well! For instance, if you plant where there is a persistant wind then the colder months will really take their toll on all but the very hardiest plants due to the extra cooling and general beating they will experience. You can match these grades to their US equivalents when buying as well but the RHS has created this guide specifically for the

KEEP OFF THE GRASS?

Don't put away the lawn mower so readily come the darker days as most of the time the temperature is above freezing so the lawn keeps growing. When a winter garden looks bare, it looks much better to have a smart lawn.

Some professional gardeners say that they don't think that people walking on frosty or snowy lawns does discernible harm whilst others are adamant that it damages the lawn.

It's perhaps a case of whether a lot of walking takes place - and the condition you like to keep your lawn in. A family lawn gets a lot more use than a decorative lawn but any damage is considered ok - nothing to worry about and fixed next spring.

TO DIG OR NOT TO DIG?

If we don't get any winter frosts then there will be little benefit from digging soil over in the autumn. One thing you can do though is to layer manure or compost on the beds in autumn. The worms and microorganisms then dig the soil for you! Then again, digging can be therapuetic so there's no harm in that either.

Hopefully this mini guide will give you some thoughts on what to buy for your garden this autumn & winter. Bulbs can be planted ready for next spring so take a look there as well - something to look forward to as we journey through another season. All stay safe and learn with us but most of all... Sight Loss Charity announces continued COVID-19 support after successful radio scheme during pandemic

The sight loss charity, **British Wireless for the Blind Fund** is heralding the success of its latest project after the innovative BWBFConnect service helped more than 600 vulnerable people with sight loss to maintain their independence and fight isolation during the height of the pandemic. The charity will now extend the program for several more months to provide ongoing support for those who are continuing to shield at home for age or health reasons.

BWBF provides specially adapted audio equipment such as DAB/FM radios free of charge to those with sight loss. It was forced to make the difficult decision to suspend face-to-face home installation services in March as a direct result of social distancing regulations. Committed to finding alternative ways to support the vulnerable and minimise isolation and loneliness, the organisation fast tracked the launch of a COVID-secure alternative, offering doorstep delivery of their devices along with telephone support during receipt, unboxing and installation of the radios.

To date, more than 600 free radios have been issued under the BWBF Connect scheme. The devices play a significant role in delivering vital news and information, along with entertainment and, perhaps most importantly of all, a friendly voice and essential companionship at a time when many people are separated from their friends and families.

Sophie Wheldon, BWBF Regional Development Manager said, "Having never attempted anything of this scale before, we were naturally unsure about whether a socially-distanced installation and support service would be possible, but we have been completely overwhelmed by the success of the scheme. We are very proud to have been able to deliver more than 600 devices to people living with sight loss at a time when they really were needed most.

"We've carefully listened to feedback, and we know that many of the people we support are continuing to shield, which is why we've made the decision to extend the adapted BWBF Connect service for the foreseeable future."

The charity has received incredibly positive feedback during the scheme's trial period, with one radio recipient noting that, "At first I couldn't put on the radio stations. A BWBF team member talked me through it over the phone and he was so clear. He couldn't have been better: patient and understanding."

Due to social distancing regulations and an urgent need to protect the health of the vulnerable, the charity will continue to offer direct courier delivery and a telephone set-up service.

BWBF phone lines have remained open during the pandemic, and will remain open with staff and volunteers carrying out many of their duties from home to continue providing necessary support for those with sight loss.



After I left my job to foster full-time, I saw the benefits straight away. I know I have made a difference to children's lives, and since I started fostering I have also had two children of my own, and having other children in the house has enriched their lives too. "The support from Nottinghamshire County Council is really good, there is always someone at the end of the phone, and the training is excellent. "If anyone is thinking of fostering, I would say - definitely look into it more. It's really rewarding and the matching process between a child and their foster carer is great."

As the pandemic continues to evolve, the council is calling for more foster carers, like Helen, to help transform the lives of young people across the county. Nottinghamshire County Council offers high-quality bespoke local training to all foster carers and provides ongoing support.

Councillor Philip Owen, Chairman of Children's Services for Nottinghamshire Council, said "While the country currently continues to have restrictions and guidelines due to the coronavirus pandemic, it is important to remember that there are still children and young people out there who need our help. "We really value our foster carers and pay them in line with the National Minimum Fostering Allowances, which sees foster carers receiving weekly payments plus additional allowances for special occasions, such as a Looked After Child's birthday, providing a regular income to support them in this important role.

"Foster carers approved by the Council provide a best value care placement when compared with other care providers, such as independent fostering agencies, so I would encourage anyone who is at a crossroads in their career or who has the time to dedicate to foster care, to find out more on our website and enquire about fostering with Nottinghamshire County Council."


