John Flynn Opticians' new machine, though, builds on this technology to create 4D imagery accurate to just a single micron - one hundredth of the width of a human hair.

The system also uses artificial intelligence to track the exact position of successive scans, overlaying them precisely to check changes over successive months or years. Fast, contact-free and painless, the system can also send images to hospital departments for other clinicians to review in the event of a referral.

"We can use the technology to examine tiny details that help us to detect eye disease at the earliest stages, reducing the risk of sight loss and improving our patients' lives," says Dr Janjua.

Naturally technology is nothing without expertise, and so Dr. Janjua is committed to interpreting the results of a scan and explaining findings in an accessible way. 



New personalized service those impacted by dementia in Nottinghamshire

Endorsed in the NHS Long Term Plan and forming a key part of Nottinghamshire's Dementia Well Pathway, the Alzheimer's Society are delighted to be able to launch their new Dementia Connect service in the county, providing support, guidance and hope to individuals with dementia, as well as their carers, friends and families.

Dementia Connect's dedicated team of dementia advisers are on hand to assist residents with a wide range of different support types, from simply wanting further information on dementia as a condition, to creating a dementia-friendly home, to support with legal and financial documents and signposting on to dementia groups and partner organisations, Dementia Connect allows for that early intervention so badly needed in our society. A new service user will work with their allocated dementia adviser to agree individualised outcomes to work towards, and once these are completed, they have the option of setting new outcomes or simply wishing to be checked in with every few months to see how they are.

Dementia Connect is a completely free service, it's easy to access (there's no need to be referred by a professional) and can genuinely make a positive difference to the lives of those who access the service. Dementia Connect is also accessible to people even if they don't have a dementia diagnosis, with support being available to those with a mild cognitive impairment or those who are concerned they may be experiencing symptoms.

The Alzheimer's Society labels the word 'dementia' as describing a set of symptoms that over time can affect memory, problem-solving,

language and behaviour, mainly affecting individuals over the age of 65. Alzheimer's disease is a type of dementia and is also the most common. There are currently around

900,000 people in the UK living with dementia, with women accounting for a greater percentage of this number than men (62-38%). Of the total number of those with dementia in the UK, the condition accounts for 1 in 14 people over 65, with the figure rising to 1 in 6 for those over 80. Around 1 in 20 individuals with dementia are under 65, accounting for around 42,000 people. In the county of Nottinghamshire, by 2025 the estimated number of people living with dementia will be approximately 18,000, with the figure due to rise to around 21,000 by 2030, according to the new Dementia Well Pathway set out by the Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Integrated Care System.

The Alzheimer's Society have been running the Dementia Connect services in many areas across England, Wales and Northern Ireland, and are delighted that Nottinghamshire residents can now seek to benefit from the introduction of its services. At the time of writing, residents will also soon have the opportunity to access Cognitive Stimulation Therapy for those with mild to moderate dementia, and carers' information sessions, both of which are unique to the service in the county.





The longest ever wait for a Premier League return is over - Nottingham Forest are back.

It has been 23 years since top-flight football was last played on the banks of the River Trent.

Sunday's 1-0 Championship play-off final victory against Huddersfield Town to seal promotion at Wembley came 8,414 days since Forest's last Premier League game when relegated in 1999.

They have played 1,069 league and play-off games trying to get

Getting to those matches and and back has seen them clock up more than 100,000 miles - the equivalent of circumnavigating the globe more than four times.

Two banners were unfurled by fans just before kick off at Wembley, which read "far have we travelled" and "much have we seen"

A total of twenty different managers have been at the wheel on the long road back, with Steve Cooper the man to drive them all the way to English football's promised land.

Forest's Nottingham-born captain Joe Worrall is only too aware of the long journey the club has taken supporters on.
"Thank you," he said to the fans after Sunday's win.

"You've followed us across the country for many years.

"It's been a tough football club at times, and all that has been repaid today. Forest are back in the Premier League."







The Beeston Film Festival is open for submissions once more! We don't like to rest on our laurels, so once the dust has settled we leap into action and get working on the next year's event.

We opened up submissions on March 1st, and we've already had over 50 submissions, with some really fantastic entries among them so far. It looks like the skyrocketing trend in quality is set to continue – this is going to be another busy year for us on the selection team!

There are a couple of big changes this year. First is the return of our East Midlands Focus category, dedicated to showcasing the best of our region's home-grown talent. I'm glad to see it back, because it's our way of supporting local film-makers and bringing their work to an audience who may not have realised such talent is on their doorstep.


Second is a great achievement – the Festival is now officially BIFA-accredited! This means that films selected for screening will be eligible for nomination in the prestigious British Independent Film Awards!

Festival Director John Currie says: "This is an awesome acknowledgement of work done by the team over the past eight years. By team I mean the selection crew, our fabulous jury, the sponsors, and so many interns from Nottingham Trent University, working hard to celebrate film and celebrate film-makers. And of course this would not have happened without the over 3,000 film-makers who have submitted their pride and joy to the festival. 



Nottingham's Rush to represent Britain at upcoming Youth Worlds

Nottingham's Ellie Rush is one of sixteen of the country's most promising young sailors have been selected to represent Great Britain at the Youth Sailing World Championships.

The talented youngsters, all aged 18 or under, will represent the British Youth Sailing (BYS) Team in eight classes at the 51st edition of the prestigious youth event at The Hague, Netherlands, from 8th-15th July 2022.

The sailors gained selection to the team for their performances in the 29er, 420, Nacra 15, ILCA6, iQFOiL and kiteboarding at the recent RYA Youth National Championships.

Previous Youth Worlds participants include some of today's best-known sailors including the world's most decorated Olympic sailor Sir Ben Ainslie and 2008 Beijing gold medallist Pippa Wilson.

Among those selected and making a first appearance at the Youth Worlds, Santiago Sesto-Cosby (Royal Lymington YC) is looking to draw upon venue knowledge and home similarities as the secret to success in the 29er alongside returning crew, Leo Wilkinson (Maidenhead SC).

"Qualifying for the youth world championships is an all-time dream for me," said Sesto-Cosby. "Now is the time to build up towards it to be the best we can be to represent Great Britain.

"I have sailed in the venue when I qualified for my first Optimist European Championship in 2018 and I loved it. I did well there because it's a tidal venue, very similar to Lymington. It can be very wavy too. I'm really looking forward to going back there. It will be fun in the 29er!"

Lucy Kenyon (Parkstone YC), who returns to the BYS team for a second Youth Worlds appearance, is also looking to call on previous knowledge to go one step further in 2022.

"I'm mega excited to be selected for the girls iQFOiL place for the youth worlds in The Hague. It looks like it's going to be a great event and I'm looking forward to working hard over the next few months trying to beat last year's fourth place.

It'll be an awesome start to this year's international racing season and I'm excited to kick it off with a bang."

Making a third appearance at the Youth Worlds will be Nacra 15 helm Jasmine Williams, this time sailing with crew Sam Cox (both Restronguet SC). Charlie Dixon (Blackwater YC) takes on the boy's iQFOiL fleet with Ellen Morley and Hazel McDonnell (both Hollowell SC) contesting the 29er girls.

Thommie Grit (Royal Hospital School) was picked in the boy's ILCA6 with Wales' Honor Procter

(Cardiff Bay YC) taking on the girls.

Procter said: "I'm so thrilled to be selected for the Youth Worlds, it's been a long and hard winter of training and now I'm looking forward to competing against some of the best ILCA6 youth sailors in the world."

Drop in Cafe

Receiving a diagnosis of Parkinson's can be an anxious time for patients and their loved ones. Information may be available in leaflets at the hospital or GP surgery or online at www.parkinsons.org.uk (the major charity that offers support and information). But nothing compares with sharing concerns and receiving reassurances from someone who has walked that path before you, whether as a person living with Parkinson's or a Carer. This is what awaits you if you visit a Parkinson's UK Drop In Cafe.

It is estimated that around 300 people are living with Parkinson's in Broxtowe, with about the same number in Long Eaton, Ilkeston and West Nottingham. The Beeston Drop In Cafe meets on the 3rd Saturday of every month at The RC Church Hall on Foster Avenue. With the tram and bus station so close, and a free car park and step free access, people living with Parkinsons and their carers in the area can enjoy 2 hours of chat, advice and a plentiful supply of tea, coffee and cakes. We also have visits from health professionals and others who can provide specific advice on Exercise, accessing services, etc. There is no charge although donations to the tea fund are welcome.



From Shakespeare's thinly disguised commentaries Elizabeth and James I respectively to Peter Morgan's reimagining of the Royals as high-end Soap Opera in The Crown, the audience for these gilded dramas has never

Spencer

Kristin Stewart brings her own brand of sparkle and unpredictability to this intense, poetic take on Princess Diana. Whether Diana was really like this or not is sort of missing the point. Pablo Larraín's film is a tightly wound character study of a woman unravelling under intense pressure and as a consequence plays out as much as a psychological horror as it does conventional drama.




The Queen

Given the intense scrutiny the modern day Royals find themselves under, it's quite rare to find Elizabeth II at the centre of a movie narrative. Helen Mirren transcends as a Queen in semiexile after the death of Diana, facing a crossroads in her reign and, more immediately, a beguiling stag that haunts her estate in the Scottish Highlands.

Joel Edgerton and David Michôd's masterful retelling of the 'Henriad' exerts a compelling, epic grip that makes it one of the best historical films since Gladiator.

Mrs Brown

Judi Dench cemented her reputation as one of the world's most accomplished screen actors with this moving portrayal of a grieving Queen Victoria. But perhaps the film's biggest surprise was the unexpected, nuanced performance of Scottish comedian Billy Connolly as the 'commoner' who encouraged her to return to public life.

The Lion In Winter

One of three stage plays adapted for the screen on this list, The Lion In Winter brings together the titanic screen presences of Katherine Hepburn and Peter O'Toole for a heady dose of relationship fireworks. They really don't make 'em like this any more. Notable too for Anthony Hopkins making his screen debut.

A Man For All Seasons

I was forced to watch this at school and was ready to write it off until the genius of writer Robert Bolt's characters and the play's moral conscience completely captivated me. A film as relevant now as it was when first released. Watch out for a late-period Orson Welles filling up the frame with his interpretation of Cardinal Wolsey.

The Madness Of King George

A film in which the a King descends into 'madness' only to be retrieved from the abyss by a radical form of treatment. Gentle, funny, heartbreaking and sumptuous all at once, this is British period filmmaking at its finest.

Viceroy's House



Prepare now for kids summer garden activities



Notts mum praises network of support to urge more people to become foster carers

A caring Nottinghamshire woman has spoken about the 'amazing' life-changing experience of giving children a settled and loving home as a foster carer.

Amy, who has been a foster carer with Nottinghamshire County Council for five years, says the fulfilling role 'has filled us with the most amazing love, empathy and adoration'.

She has shone a light on life as a foster carer as part of Foster Care Fortnight, a national campaign which ran until 22th May and raises awareness of foster care and the need for new carers.

This year's campaign focused on #FosteringCommunities and aims to highlight the many ways people across the fostering community support each other, as well as celebrating the various communities involved in fostering.

Amy said: "Fostering, in a nutshell, is giving a child the chance to live in a family and be loved and adored unconditionally.

"Fostering has changed our whole life. It's tested our strengths and given us moments of deep sadness, but it has filled us with the most amazing love, empathy, and adoration.

"And it's those feelings that overpower everything and give us an uncontrollable passion to do it all again – and again, and again.

"Seeing a child arrive at your door in desperation and then leave with the biggest contented smile is addictive.

"Fostering for Nottinghamshire County Council feels like a circle of support all around you.

"There is always someone to turn to whatever and whenever you need help, along with a vast array of focused training available.

"On top of that is the added bonus of days out for birth children, talent shows, foster carers hubs, picnics, discounts and vouchers."


There are more than 232 children living with foster families in Nottinghamshire and the number needing foster care keeps rising.

Youngsters can enter foster care for a variety of reasons and could be due to a parent's illness or a specific problem which means they cannot be cared for by their own family.

Some children may have witnessed domestic violence or drug abuse, and others may have been abused or neglected.

Several foster families look after children on a short-term basis but, for many, fostering offers them a secure, permanent home.

Foster carers provide support and care in a family setting and enable children to stay in their local community to minimise further disruption to their lives by helping them stay in their school, close to their friends, and maintaining connections with other family members.



Throughout Foster Care Fortnight, there was a focus on this year's theme . . . fostering communities.

Nottinghamshire's foster carers benefit from support hubs, which meet on a regular basis and talk about different issues as well as offer advice and help.

There is also the Fostering Liaison Advisory Group (FLAG) committee run by the foster carers, which provides an opportunity for carers to meet regularly and hear updates from the fostering service, professionals, and other organisations about the children they look after.

The county council also hosts a range of events for foster carers and their families, such as the annual Fostering's Got Talent night, and Sons and Daughters' Day which is dedicated to the birth children of foster families.

Councillor Tracey Taylor, Chairman of the council's Children and Young People's Committee, said: "Our foster carers do an amazing job taking care of vulnerable

babies, children and teenagers, but we need more carers to ensure that every child in need can have a safe, loving, and stable home environment.

"If you think you have the space in your home and your heart, and the skills needed to help children thrive, please get in touch with our friendly fostering team.

"You can become a foster carer no matter your age, gender, relationship status or sexual orientation.

"We're really hoping that more people will consider becoming part of our wonderful fostering community."

Red Sky at Night will be touring nationally until 22nd October. It will be performed alongside Raising Agents, Maeve Larkin's play about the Women's Institute.






