

Windrush 75: Celebrating Caribbean Food in the UK By Catherine Ross and courtesy of www.souschef.co.uk

Catherine Ross is the founder of The National Caribbean Heritage Museum, Museumand. She came to the UK from the island of Saint Kitts in 1958, and moved to Nottingham with her parents and siblings. Here she shares some powerful food memories from that time.

This year, Windrush Day is the 75th anniversay of the arrival of the Windrush ship to Britain in 1948. Between 1948 and 1971 many more Caribbeans and citizens from across the British Commonwealth arrived in the UK to help rebuild postwar Britain.

Windrush Day celebrates British Caribbean communities, and acknowledge the sacrifices and contributions the Windrush generation and their descendants have made to British society. Sous Chef, invited Catherine to talk about her memories of that time, particularly focussing on food.

What is typical "Caribbean food"?

Caribbean food is intrinsically linked to the Transatlantic Slave Trade and its impact on Africa and the Caribbean. Around 12 million Africans were enslaved and forced to work long hours on plantations owned by British and European colonists in the Caribbean, used to grow crops like sugar, coffee, and rice.

Enslaved people were given starchy foods like sweet potatoes, yams and green bananas to give them the energy to keep going and survive the hard work and harsh treatment they endured. Protein and other body-building foods were rationed and restricted to certain types and only given in small amounts, such as the bits of animals that the plantation owners didn't want to eat themselves.

A poor diet hurt and hindered the lives not only of those who were enslaved, but successive generations of their descendants, including the Windrush Generation with illnesses that affect black people still, today.

The legacy of our food heritage is still evident today, from many of the ingredients we use, to the recipes that have evolved from island to island, and generation to generation.

What are the health benefits of Caribbean food?

Starchy foods in large and regular quantities may have had a negative impact on the health of Caribbean people over the centuries, but it's also provided some health benefits, which are now scientifically-recognised.

Sweet potatoes contain vitamins, minerals, antioxidants and fibre. Yams are thought to boost brain health, reduce inflammation, and improve blood sugar control. While green bananas contain nutrients like vitamin B6 which helps to boost metabolism and keep cells healthy.

Which ingredients and recipes have come from the Windrush generation?

Caribbeans have benefited from our ancestors' resilience and culinary creativity, with the Windrush Generation sharing their legacy with the UK.

From their love of spice and seasoning techniques which helped to create tasty dishes out of very basic ingredients, to their clever pairing of different vegetables and cooking techniques, such as escoveitch and jerk, which ensured scarcity didn't have a dire impact on their diet.

Today, vegetables and fruits loved by Caribbeans regularly appear in British dishes and cookbooks, and on the ingredients list of many beauty products and treatments. Many of their seeds are also widely available in garden centres and are being grown by different communities in gardens and allotments

The Caribbean contribution to health, beauty and wellbeing is now widely recognised and applauded, brought to the UK by the Windrush Generation and evolved by their descendants.

It's also testament to Caribbeans' willingness to share their secrets in response to familiar compliments like "Your skin looks great!" and "You don't seem to have aged at all and I've known you for years!" It's all down to a Caribbean diet and wellbeing traditions packed full of fruits and vegetables.

There was a TV ad back in the day which said: "It looks good, it tastes good, and by goodness it does you good". For Caribbeans and those from other cultures discovering Caribbean food, our food-themed exhibitions and events all have a simple message: Caribbean food is history on a plate – offering you a tour of the Caribbean from your very own kitchen.

FRIED PLANTAIN RECIPE

Ingredients

2 Ripe plantains
Vegetable oil
Sea salt (optional)
Squeeze of lime
(optional)



Method

- Cut the 2 ends off the plantain.
- Score the peel lengthwise and try not to cut the plantain flesh before peeling and opening up the skin with your hands.
- · Slice on the diagonal of about 1 cm thick.
- Put enough oil in the Dutch pot or frying pan to either shallow or deep fry. Only when the oil is hot, put some of the plantain pieces in the pan BUT do not overcrowd the pan. It's best to fry in small batches.
- Fry in a Dutch pot or frying pan for 1-2 minutes on both sides on a medium-high heat until they are golden brown.
- Place the cooked plantain pieces onto a piece of kitchen roll to get rid of the excess oil.







Summer is here at last! For many of us, that means barbecues and evening walks and trips to the beach. For us here at Beeston Film Festival, it means more film submissions to watch and rate for next year!

While we work on the ins-and-outs of bringing feature films into the fold, we're making sure not to neglect the wonderful short films that have been our bread and butter for the last 9 years. They're coming in thick and fast, so we're spending as much time as we can sorting through them and finding the best of the best.

Here are a few of the highest-rated submissions so far:

Ourselves Alone is a crime thriller inspired by the real-life 2004 robbery of the Northern Bank in Belfast. It's a tightlywound, tense flick that follows the bank robbers as internal tensions threaten to force the group apart.

On a lighter note **The Father, The Son and The Rav Kalmenson** is a brilliant French comedy about the struggles of an Orthodox Jewish father to help his son understand the importance of taking the Shabbat seriously. I haven't laughed this hard in a while!

Diables is a documentary about the yearly correfoc or 'fire run' in Girona, Catalonia, where the titular group of 'devils' perform with fire and pyrotechnics. It's gorgeously shot and gives a real insight into why the performers risk burns or worse for the sake of cultural expression.

Horror short **Ariane's Baby** is a tense and moody exploration of the fears of motherhood, as pregnant Ariane does nightly battle with a demonic force that seems tied to the growing life within her, leaving her to wonder if she'll be able to care for the child when they're finally born.

Metaphysical comedy **Feirg** tackles the great mystery of life: what happens to us after death? Whatever it is, it apparently starts with an unconventional group therapy session to help us come to terms with our untimely demise. It's a funny and thoughtful take on grief.

There's more where these came from, and I can't wait to share them with you all!

Adoption East Midlands supports campaign to find adopters for children who wait the longest...

Today, Adoption East Midlands is joining forces with agencies across the country to support a new #YouCanAdopt campaign to find families for children who wait the longest.

The new campaign aims to reach potential parents for children from certain groups that repeatedly wait longest to be adopted and sees a series of new films released featuring real life stories from those who have adopted children, and others who have been adopted themselves. The films spotlight the various means of support available throughout the adoption journey from adoption agencies, social care workers, charities, employers, friends, relatives, peers and more.

Each year, Adoption East Midlands needs to find adoptive families for approximately 170 children. Without enough families coming forward, children wait longer.

The majority of children waiting for adoption come from specific groups repeatedly facing the longest delays in finding a home. These groups include children aged five or over, children with additional and/or complex needs, brother and sister groups, and those from a black and mixed

heritage. Compared to children without these characteristics, children from these groups wait an average of eight months longer from entry into care to adoption, a total of 32 months.

Black and mixed heritage children wait two months longer than average to be adopted from care, with delays caused because there are not enough black and mixed heritage adopters coming forward to adopt children from the same background. This is why, as part of the campaign, a specialised recruitment drive will run to encourage black and mixed heritage people to consider adoption.

For anyone considering adopting a child who would typically wait longer, Adoption East Midlands has professional adoption support teams who can offer a wide range of support throughout the child's journey through to adulthood – you will not be alone at any step of the way.

To help find parents for these children, the You Can Adopt campaign aims to encourage potential adopters by acknowledging that, while these groups of children will need additional support, the power of family and a permanent home can be transformational for these children, and a circle of support is available to help adopters on this journey.

Head of service for Adoption East Midlands, Shelagh Mitchell, commented: "Adoption East Midlands is delighted to support this new national campaign that shines a light on those children who

typically wait the longest to be adopted. We find families for children with a diverse range of needs and from a diverse range of backgrounds who need people to offer them a safe, nurturing and loving home so that they can thrive and flourish.

"Adoption East Midlands believes that support is vital for a successful adoption and works with families to identify the right support for them. We offer ongoing support to our children and families from their first weeks of placement through to support as an adopted adult. It includes many different forms - whether support with identifying therapeutic services, help to answer a child's questions about their adoption or connecting them with other adoptive families."

Nottinghamshire County Council Cabinet Member for Children and Families, Councillor Tracey Taylor, said: "Across Nottinghamshire there are children who are waiting to be adopted. If you are considering adoption and can offer a stable, loving home, I urge you to speak to our dedicated team who will be happy to provide the advice, information and support you need."

The Summer Reading Challenge 2023 is at Inspire libraries

Libraries in Nottinghamshire are getting ready for an action-packed reading adventure, as the Summer Reading Challenge returns for 2023!

The Summer Reading Challenge asks 4-11 year olds to borrow and read any six library books over the summer. This annual challenge is produced by The Reading Agency and runs in partnership with libraries across the country, and helps maintain children's reading over the summer break. Inspire library staff and volunteers are ready to welcome thousands of children into the library. Over 9,400 children joined the challenge in 2022.

To take part all children need to do is to head to their local library where they will be given their collector folder to keep a record of their reading journey. It's completely free to join, and every child who completes the challenge will receive a medal and a certificate. Children choose the books they want to read on their challenge; stories, fact books, joke books – all reading counts!

This year's challenge is a collaboration with the Youth Sport Trust and celebrates the power of play, sports and games.

Through taking part in the challenge, with free packs from public libraries, children will be able to join six fictional characters – the superstar Ready, Set, Read! team (and their animal mascots) – as they use their skills to weave through a summer obstacle course.

There's also a special Mini Reading Challenge running for children under four, to help get little ones interested in reading!





Beeston Wildlife Group celebrates completed transformation of Attenborough Nature Centre Garden.

Members of Beeston Wildlife Group (BWG) celebrated their success last week with the completion of the Attenborough Nature Centre Garden transformation, after over 6 months of hard work. The group worked with Nottinghamshire Wildlife Trust's Southern Reserve Manager, Chris Kennedy, to transform the space into a haven for wildlife.

Nottinghamshire Wildlife Trust (NWT), which has been supporting local groups in working towards a wilder Nottinghamshire for 60 years, has been working with BWG since the early 2000's. The group of

local enthusiasts formed in 1996, with the aim of engaging others with wildlife by providing access to various nature walks and talks.

The group took on the garden project in Autumn of 2022, and immediately got to work drawing up plans to transform the space. Through the seasons, they worked on the space rain or shine, or snow!

The transformed space boasts a newly dug pond with a dipping platform, already bringing smooth newts and many common blue damselflies to the area. The group also planted a wildflower meadow, which is currently a stunning sea of ox-eye daisies, yellow rattle and ragged robin - attracting a whole host of insects and pollinators. For children, there is a mud kitchen, pebble labyrinth and willow tunnel to explore. A brand-new fence has also been built along the edges of the water.

Nigel Slater, Vice Chairman and one of the longest standing group members stated: "The space is achieving what we had hoped, the wildlife is coming in and every day we are counting new species that are appearing. We are looking forward to working closely with Nottinghamshire Wildlife Trust on more projects in the future."

The celebrations saw BWG and NWT staff come together to enjoy the

garden, including NWT Chief Executive Paul Wilkinson. It began with a ribbon cutting by Chairman Andrew Lee, whilst Adrian Biddulph proudly unveiled the weathervane on the roof of the new structure, which adds a sheltered seating area for the public to enjoy – whether that's enjoying the view or a bite to eat outside. Two new wheelchair friendly picnic benches have also been installed.

Andrew Lee stated "The Beeston Wildlife Group has been very pleased to work with NWT on this project and it's been a real team effort with contributions from many people.

We hope we have transformed the wildlife garden into a space where visitors enjoy spending time. If they learn about wildlife or take away ideas about how they can improve their homes for the benefit of wildlife, then that's great."

The garden includes insect hotels, log piles and nest boxes, which have been utilised by four blue tit families this season. The popular sand martin hide is also situated at the bottom of the garden, which at this time of year is buzzing with activity. BWG are excited to maintain the garden with an ongoing planting programme to attract wildlife and will be adding informative signs as to why these plants are valuable.

The inspiration behind the space is to show people what can be done with a relatively small area to make room for nature – and encourage people to adopt similar techniques in their own outdoor spaces.

There are signs throughout the garden, describing each area and why it is beneficial to wildlife. The group hopes that this will inspire the public to go home and take action for nature on their doorstep.

Paul Wilkinson, Chief Executive of Nottinghamshire Wildlife Trust said, "This garden will hopefully provide lots of people with the inspiration to take action for nature in their own lives - at home, at work, at school - and that this will help create more spaces for wildlife to thrive."
