Now available in Beeston Breakthrough treatment for **Dry Eye Disease (DED)**



Garden birds are counting on you! Big Garden Birdwatch 2024



 In 2023, over half a million people across the UK took part, counting more than 9 million birds.

• With birds now facing so many challenges due to the nature and climate emergency, every count matters.

This year's event takes place on 26th, 27th and 28th January 2024. People across the UK are asked to spend an hour watching and counting the birds in their garden, balcony or local park, then send their results to the RSPB. This year's event marks 45 years since the first Big Garden Birdwatch. Starting in 1979, it has since become a much-loved annual citizen science event, that gives the RSPB a valuable snapshot of how our garden birds are doing in the UK. Over that time, 185 million birds have been counted and nearly 11.5 million hours spent watching and counting garden birds. Beccy Speight, the RSPB's Chief Executive, said: "By taking part in the Birdwatch you are joining hundreds of thousands of people from across the UK, united in a love of nature, to play an important role in helping us understand how our UK birds are doing. Big Garden Birdwatch demonstrates the power that people have when they come together for nature. Join us for Big Garden Birdwatch 2024 and together let's take action to help birds and other wildlife thrive for generations to come." House Sparrows celebrated their 20th year as the number one bird spotted in UK gardens in 2023. While nearly 1.5 million were spotted across the January weekend, House Sparrows have sadly suffered severe declines. In fact, the number spotted in gardens has dropped by nearly 60% since the Big Garden Birdwatch first began in 1979. Over its four decades, Big Garden Birdwatch has highlighted the winners and losers in the garden bird world. The Long-tailed Tit, a much-loved species, rose five positions in the rankings last year, with numbers 39% higher than in 2022. However, Longtailed Tits are susceptible to harsh weather conditions, with the numbers recorded fluctuating since the Big Garden Birdwatch began.

Meanwhile, Greenfinches and Chaffinches have been badly affected by a disease known as Trichomonosis. As a result, the UK Chaffinch population has declined by 37% over the last decade, while Greenfinches have declined by 62% over the same time frame.

The Birdwatch was first to alert the RSPB to the decline in Song Thrush numbers, which are down 80% compared to the first Big Garden Birdwatch in 1979. This species was a firm fixture in the top 10 in 1979 but by 2009, its numbers were less than half those recorded 30 years beforehand. The Song Thrush scraped in at number 20 in the rankings this year, seen in just 9% of gardens.

Beccy added: "The birds we see in our gardens, from our balconies, and in our parks, are a lively, colourful and endlessly fascinating part of all our lives. They connect us with the vital natural world. By taking part in the Birdwatch, you and hundreds of thousands like you, play an important role in helping us understand how UK birds are doing. With birds and other wildlife now facing so many challenges due to the nature and climate emergency, every count matters."

To take part in the Big Garden Birdwatch 2024, watch the birds on your balcony, in your garden or in your local green space for one hour at some point over the three days. Only count the birds that land, not those flying over. Tell us the highest number of each bird species you see at any one time – not the total you see in the hour.

Recycling should be 'one of East Midlands' last resorts' says Keep Britain Tidy ahead of 'Buy Nothing New Month' campaign. **Environmental charity** encourages people to make 2024 the year of saving pennies and the planet...

As people across the East Midlands prepare for the year ahead, environmental charity Keep Britain

Tidy is issuing a challenge: can you manage to buy nothing new, for just one month?

Award-winning campaign Buy Nothing New Month, which will run until the end of January, encourages people to save their pennies - and the planet - by making small changes to their buying habits, such as resisting purchases, buying preloved or finding innovative ways to reuse, repair or rehome things that might have been destined for the bin.

The challenge comes following a YouGov poll on behalf of the charity, which found that 67% of adults in the region - Lincolnshire, Northamptonshire, Derbyshire, Nottinghamshire, Leicestershire and Rutland - mistakenly believe recycling is the best thing they can do to reduce the environmental impact of the things they buy. Alarmingly, a further 80% believe that recycling is a form of waste prevention.

The "waste hierarchy" - a framework that ranks how we manage our waste according to what is best for the environment - gives priority to preventing waste in the first place, followed by re-use, recycling, recovery and, last of all, disposal.

Keep Britain Tidy's Chief Executive Allison Ogden-Newton OBE said: "It's time to connect the dots. Buying new things has an impact on the environment.

"To tackle the damage done to the planet by our excessive consumption, the focus needs to shift from mindlessly throwing things away to thinking about

what we buy in the first place and what we do with things we no longer want or need.

"Fifty-seven per-cent of adults in the region agreed they are concerned about the carbon footprint of their purchases, and so our award-winning Buy Nothing New Month campaign is the perfect time to stop and consider whether we really need something new.

"We need to stop kidding ourselves that recycling is a solution – it's a last

Encouragingly, three quarters (75%) of East Midlands adults in the YouGov survey agreed they are aware of things they can do, in addition to recycling, to reduce the environmental impact of the things they buy.

Buy Nothing New Month is managed by Keep Britain Tidy and supported by our partner Olio, the local sharing app where people can find and share items with others living nearby.

Tessa Clarke, CEO and co-founder of Olio said: "We have more than enough 'stuff' in our local communities, which is why Olio is thrilled to support the Buy Nothing New campaign. We really hope this campaign will inspire millions more Brits to start sharing instead of shopping. It's a great way to start the new year - by saving money, saving the planet, and supporting your local community.'

Throughout January, Keep Britain Tidy and sustainability and lifestyle experts will share tips on how people can resist the lure of January sales bargains they really don't need or maybe can't afford; signpost them to options such as repair, renting, borrowing, or reusing what they already have in their homes.

Everyone can play their part by finding simple alternatives to buying new, such as abstaining in the first place, repairing instead of replacing, buying pre-loved, or borrowing items from community sharing apps. Around 81% of people we surveyed after 2023's campaign agreed they 'feel proud" of themselves for trying to buy less new stuff.

7,900 people homeless in the East Midlands today Homelessness rises by 33% in a year as housing emergency escalates

New research from Shelter shows at least 7,900 people in the East Midlands spent Christmas without a home, including 3,600 children. This is a stark increase of 33% in one year.

Shelter's comprehensive analysis of official homelessness figures and responses to Freedom of Information requests reveal homelessness in the region has risen rapidly in just 12 months: 213 people are sleeping rough on any given night (18% increase) and 7,300 are living in temporary accommodation (31% increase) - most of whom are families.

Shelter's research also looks at places across the East Midlands where homelessness is most acute. Nottingham has the highest number of people without a home, with 2,000 people homeless, followed by West Northamptonshire where 1,330 people are homeless and 970 people in Leicester.

Councils have a legal duty to house families and people who are vulnerable, but the acute shortage of affordable homes means they are having to rely on temporary accommodation for long periods. The growing emergency is leaving families stuck for months in grotty hostels, B&Bs and cramped bedsits, often having to share beds with no, or inadequate, cooking and laundry facilities. People not entitled to accommodation may end up on the streets, sofa-surfing or in dangerous living conditions.


Shelter's frontline services are dealing with the grim reality of rising homelessness every day from supporting families crammed into a one-room B&B with mouldy walls and bed bugs, to providing emergency assistance to people faced with a night on the streets. The charity has launched an urgent appeal calling on the public to help it be there for people experiencing homelessness this winter.

Polly Neate, chief executive of Shelter, said: "Homelessness is on nobody's Christmas list, but 7,900 people in the East Midlands will have spent this time of year in a tiny hostel room or freezing in a doorway.

"The housing emergency is out of control. Chronic underinvestment in social homes has left people unable to afford skyrocketing private rents and plunged record numbers into homelessness. It is appalling that the government has allowed thousands of families to be packed into damp and dirty B&B's and hostel rooms, which are traumatising children and making people desperately ill.





at Beeston Station 2023

Honouring the local railway men that joined the armed forces in WW1.

Friends of Beeston Station (FOBS) are looking for your help...



Beeston Station and Beeston Sidings were once thriving operations employing far more people than they do today. Although a reserved occupation, a number of railway men from Beeston volunteered to fight in the war or were later conscripted.

Sarah Hampton, Secretary of FOBs and co-ordinator of the project, said, 'This has been an interesting piece of work, which we may develop further in future years. We know that many local men joined the armed forces and of these, at least 16 worked at Beeston Station or the Sidings. We have included information about two of them who died in the war'.

The two men who died were Rifleman Harry Barnes and Lance Corporal Arthur Charles Russell. Both were awarded posthumous military decorations, and their names can be seen on the memorials in St John's Church, Beeston.

The display also includes 170 'recycled' red poppies representing all those soldiers from Beeston who died in the war.

FOBS would welcome information about men and women associated with Beeston Station between 1914 and 1918, which they might be able to include in their display later in the year.

'It would be good to know more about those who worked at the station and either kept the railways running or fought in the war.' Sarah said. 'Any family memories would be interesting'.



Brits gear up
for 'Sunshine
Saturday' as
psychotherapist
reveals why our
brain 'needs' a
holiday - and how
many to take per year...

Sunshine Saturday (6th January) is traditionally the most popular day of the year to book a getaway – an expert has shared why we don't just want a holiday, our brain literally "needs it".

TV psychotherapist Anna Williamson has shared how researching holidays and pressing the 'book now' button can alter our brain chemistry for the better.

The 42-year-old also reveals reasons why a weekend break might be better than a longer trip and how many days into a journey our mind and body really start to relax.

Anna also answers one key question: how many holidays do we really need per year to feel rested? "I would say we don't just want a holiday... we need it," said Anna, who worked with TUI on this project. "The minute December festivities are over, many people experience a hormone crash. "Our brain chemistry is altered by this heightened state of joy and so it is craving another oxytocin and dopamine hit — which are our brains' reward, comfort, and love hormones. "That's why we scramble to book a holiday in January, inspiring the phenomenon known as Sunshine Saturday, to help re-create the buzz."

Studies show that so-called 'braincations' trigger the release of neurotransmitters and can boost mood, reduce stress and improve cognitive function.

A holiday also improves our ability to think creatively and can have lasting effects on the nervous system, allowing it to better recover from injuries such as strokes and improve heart health.

According to TUI's study, most Brits would have started looking for this year's holiday on New Year's Day and around four in 10 (37%) are likely to book a summer holiday around this time of year.

On average it takes the typical adult 53 hours – more than two days – to find their dream holiday.

So, what is the optimal number of holidays per year? The answer is a little complicated. Anna said: "There is no definitive amount of time humans need in order to stay healthy, however [at least] two holidays a year is deemed to be a realistic sweet spot for most.

"Many studies suggest that taking a break every two months, even if that is a day or two, is necessary to avoid feelings of anxiety, stress, fatigue, and physical illness.

"Other research suggests that little and often can be a very good solution to keeping rested – as opposed to saving yourself for one trip per year."

As for what type of trip to take – a weekend city break or a two-weeklong beach holiday – it's up to you, but there are some interesting facts to consider. Anna said: "Research has found that three days into a holiday is when people feel most well-rested, less anxious and in a better mood.

"As a complete curveball to this though, if a longer holiday is preferred, some studies suggest that eight days is the sweet spot.

"Though often the pressure of one annual holiday can be counterproductive due to the stress in trying to have enforced fun, which can often overwhelm the whole point of going away."

The joy of holidays and travelling doesn't just happen on the trip itself – even just planning a journey affects the brain.

Anna said: "When we start scrolling online and looking at the holiday deals tempting us, that first spark of attraction ignites within our brain, recognising a potential reward is coming. "This hormone release is so powerful, that it starts producing dopamine, the chemical that gets released and replicates feelings humans get during activities such as eating a nice meal, shopping, or having sex.

"Dubbed the 'pathway to pleasure', the sensory experience our representational system (see, hear, feel, taste and smell) goes through is tingling with pleasure – the visuals, the memories released from previous holidays, the glossy hotel pictures. "It's all-consuming."

Previous research by TUI reveals that Brits get into a 'peak' holiday feeling 43 hours into a trip and the average person loses this sensation around 3.7 days after unpacking their bags. Meanwhile, over 2 in 10 people book their next holiday less than a month after returning home.

TUI is expecting this year's sales to be stronger than January 2022, and January 2020, before the pandemic struck.

Holidays are also known to improve sleeping patterns, which could last up to two weeks after you arrive back home, according to one study.

What you do during the holiday can also make a difference in how rested you feel afterward.


Neuroscience studies suggest that the brain gets a 'novelty' hit each time you experience something 'new' – like seeing your hotel room or having that first pool dip.

It's even been found that meditation during a trip could help you keep the 'holiday high' going for longer.

Anna said: "Be really clear with yourself and the people you are holidaying with on what you want to get out of the holiday.

So what you waiting for? Have you got your holiday plans...?
